Subject: Severe Weather: Lightning Response

Date: April 3, 2014

The severe weather season is active, and as such, the increased likelihood for lightning exists. All airlines and tenants should be familiar with established severe weather procedures and take preventative steps to protect themselves from lightning strikes.

When cloud to ground lightning has been detected within 5 miles of the airport, the Airport Communication Center (ACC) will notify airline and tenant leadership participating with the Everbridge communication system, as well as activate the visual strobe system on each ramp tower on Concourses A, B and C. As a reminder, KCAB employees will seek shelter; therefore, slight delays may be experienced when processing through the escort shacks to enter the airfield.

The ACC will send an "All clear" to leaders via Everbridge and deactivate the strobes when either of the following conditions exist:

- There has not been a cloud to ground lightning strike in the 5 mile airport radius within 15 minutes, or
- The airport's Skyguard meteorologist notifies the ACC the storm has passed the airport

Please ensure all employees are made aware and fully understand the information provided above.
