**EFFECTIVE 1700 ON JULY 10<sup>TH</sup>, 2020**

**Gov. Beshear Issues Mask Mandate for KY**

Kentucky Governor Andy Beshear has signed an Executive Order that will require all people in Kentucky to wear face coverings in public settings, effective Friday July 10<sup>th</sup> at 5 pm. The mandate is in place for 30 days and is subject to renewal. The mandate will be enforced by local health departments.

A “face covering” is a material that covers the nose and mouth and is secured to the head with ties, straps, or loops over the ears, or is wrapped around the lower face. It can be made from a variety of materials, including cotton, silk, or linen, and ideally has two or more layers. Face coverings can be factory-made, homemade, or improvised from household items such as scarves, bandanas, and t-shirts.

Per the Executive Order, people in Kentucky must cover their nose and mouth with a face covering when they are in the situations that represent a high risk of COVID-19 transmission. These situations include:

- While inside or waiting in line to enter an establishment or any other indoor public space in which it is difficult to maintain a physical distance of at least six feet from others who are not members of that person’s household;
- While waiting for or riding on public transportation or while riding in a taxi, private car service, or ride-sharing vehicle, or driving any of the above while customers are present;
- While in outdoor public spaces in which the person cannot maintain a physical distance of six feet from all individuals who are not members of the person’s household and is not otherwise covered by previously issued guidance.

Exemptions to the Order include the following:

- Children who are age 5 or younger;
- Any person with disability, or a physical or mental impairment, that prevents them from safely wearing a face covering;
- Any person engaged in work that a state or federal regulator has concluded would make wearing a face covering a risk to their health or safety;
- Any person who is seated and actively consuming food or beverage at a restaurant, bar, or other establishment that offers food or beverage service;

- Any person who is obtaining a service that requires temporary removal of the face covering in order to perform the service;
- Any person who is giving a speech or broadcast to an audience and is able to maintain a safe distance of six feet from all individuals who are not members of the person's household;
- Any person who is engaged in lawful activity where federal or state law prohibits wearing a face covering.

As noted in the Order, failure to follow the requirements provided in the Order is a violation of the Orders issued under KRS Chapter 39A and must result in a loss of access to the business's services.
